# Maintenance News & Helpful Tips!







Happy New Year from your maintenance crew!

Few tips to get you through the winter season.

If you are going to leave your house for 2 weeks or more, we recommend putting your water heater on vacation mode or at the lowest setting. It may also be a good idea to turn off your water supply at the main shut off valve to avoid unexpected leaks.

- 1. Set your thermostat to at least 67 degrees.
- 2. Do not store kitty liter near furnaces.
- 3. Please remember to keep the area around the furnace & hot water heater clear at all times.
- 4. Make sure all air vents are not blocked.
- 5. Do not use oven or stove to heat your home.
- 6. If the temperature drops below 20 degrees, keep one or two faucets running slowly at all times. This prevents pipes from freezing.
- 7. If you have ceiling fans, turn them on low in reverse (clockwise when looking up) to circulate warm air.
- 8. Plunge toilet before calling maintenance.
